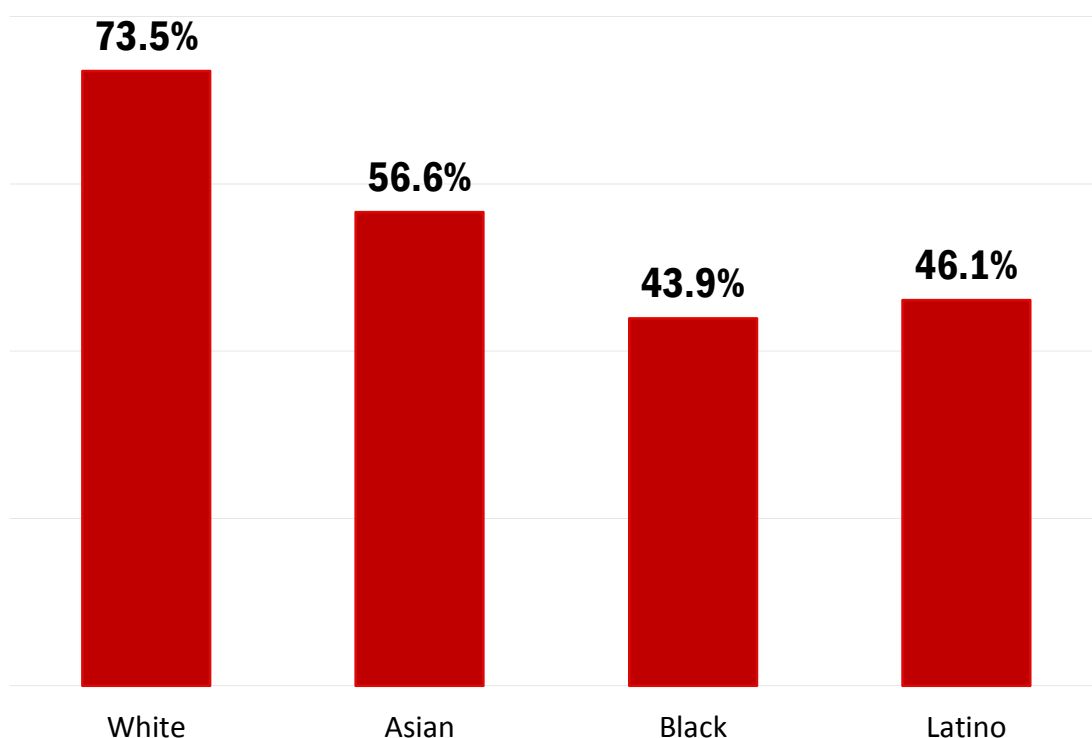


Differences in Home Ownership

For most of us, our primary asset is our home. If we have any wealth at all, it's because we've bought a home at some point in our working lives and it has appreciated in value as we've paid down the mortgage. As we can see from this fact sheet, African-Americans, Asians, and Latinos are much less likely to own their homes than are whites.*
