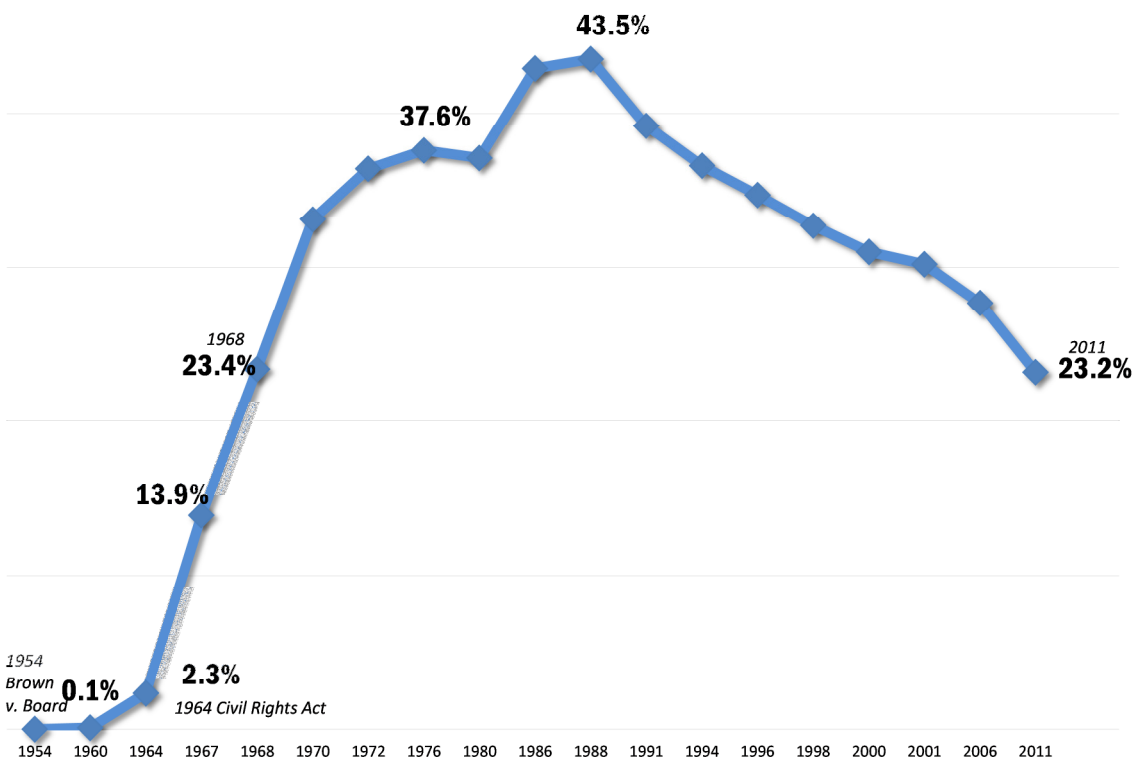


Schools Are as Segregated Now as in 1968

We have lost much—in some places all—of the progress in school desegregation made from the mid-1960's to the late 1980's.

Percentage of Black Students in Majority White Schools



Just as was true before *Brown v. Board*, today's separate schools are deeply unequal:

- Many students of color experience “double segregation” by race and income.
- Three-quarters of schools that have mostly Black and Latino students* have poverty rates above 70%.

**Black and Latino students make up more than 80% of the school.*
